Bosnia and Herzegovina (BiH) is constituted by:

the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina (FBiH),
the Republika Srpska (RS), and the separate administrative Brčko District (BD). The capital is Sarajevo. The Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina consists of 10 cantons, divided into 79 municipalities. The Republika Srpska has 62 municipalities and Brčko District has 1

Temperature and precipitations

in Sarajevo: the average annual temperature is 9.7 °C; in winter the average temperature is 0.4 °C, in summer is 18.6 °C. In July 2000 the absolute maximum temperature was recorded (38.2 °C); in January 1954 the absolute minimum temperature (-21.8 °C). The average annual precipitation in Sarajevo is 936 l/m²


Resident population: are considered residents all those who are usual residents in one place, that is, those having permanent residence there, irrespective of their presence or temporary absence at the census moment.

People employed by international employers or self-employed in the territory of BiH or abroad and members of their families will be registered as permanent residents of their usual resident place.

In the Population Census in 1961 and 1971 as resident population persons were registered where they worked at the Census moment, while in 1981 and 1991 Census these persons were enumerated as resident population in the places where their families lived






BIRTHS IN SOME BALKAN COUNTRIES AND IN EU27

POPULATION

Marriages and divorces: data

on marriages are taken from the registration offices, those on divorces from municipal courts. According to legal regulations on registration, events of marriages are obligatorily registered in population registers of the area where they took place, irrespective of the residence of persons the events refer to

Household: any group of people living together in the same dwelling who share their resources. A household is also considered every person who lives alone or with other persons but does not share resources with them



1997-2006








HEALTH

Child mortality (under 5 years of age) in BiH: in 2005 it reaches 18 deaths per 1,000 live births while the EU average estimate is 4.6. Related to this, vaccinations records show that 87% of the population are covered by basic vaccinations, which has led to a steady decline of tuberculosis, meningitis, measles and other infections


DEATHS BY CAUSES



2007, % volumes and total expenditure in KM





LIVING STANDARDS

Vehicles ownership: in 2007 more than half of the households (51.9%) owns a car in Bosnia and Herzegovina. At territorial level this share increases at 53.3 in the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina, reaches 52.2% in the Brčko District and decreases at 49.6% in the Republika Srpska. is also widespread: 24.1% at national level. Such in the Republika Sprska, 27.8% in the Brčko District and 21.6% in the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina. Motorcycles and motorbikes are owned by less than 3% of households in the whole country
















EMPLOYED BY EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT

LABOUR MARKET

Activity rate: ratio of the labour force to the correspondent reference population, i.e. the activity rate aged 15-64 is defined as a proportion of persons aged between 15 and 64 in the labour force in relation to the total population of the same age


Employment rate: ratio

of employed persons to the correspondent reference population. It usually refers to persons in employment aged between 15 and 64 in relation to the total population of the same age

Unemployment rate: ratio

of unemployed to labour force. Youth unemployment and long-term unemployment rates are also calculated: the first refers to persons aged between 15 and 24, the second is defined in terms of the period spent searching for a job, generally more than 12 months

ECONOMY

Gross Domestic Product (GDP):

final result of the productive activities of resident units. The GDP at market prices is the sum of the gross value added of all resident producers at basic prices, plus taxes less subsides on products and services

Value added: difference between total production and intermediate consumption used in production. At basic prices it excludes taxes on products but includes subsidies on products




CONTRIBUTION TO THE GDP OF BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

VALUE ADDED AT BASIC PRICES BY BRANCH





ECONOMY

GDP per capita: is calculated by dividing the GDP by the total population

Government debt: is the consolidated stock of gross debt at nominal value at the end of the year; in other words, it is the accumulated debt of a territory over the years

General Government net borrowing/lending: income statement balance showing the total expenditure and receipts of the General Government. It is the sum of current balance plus capital account balance

PRICES

Consumer price index (CPI): measures changes over time of a basket of products representative of all the products by households and purchasable in the market through monetary In 2007 the basket consisted of 646

elementary products, whose prices are collected in 12 localities (5 towns in the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina, 6 towns in the Republika Srpska and 1 in the Brčko District). In 2007, almost two thirds of the CPI annual average increase (1.5% in total) is due to the item of expenditure "Food and non-alcoholic beverages", followed by "Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels", whose contribution was around 30%

Comparative price level (PLIs): these indices refer to the total value of the individual consumption expenditures by households, non-profit institutions serving households and general government. PLIs provide a comparison of the the EU average: if a price level index is higher than 100, the country concerned is relatively more expensive than the EU average and vice versa










