TERRITORY

Bosnia and Herzegovina (BiH) consists of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina (FBiH), the Republika Srpska (RS), and the separate administrative the Brcko District (DB).

Sarajevo is the capital.

The Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina consists of 10 cantons, divided into 79 municipalities. The Republic of Srpska has 62 municipalities. Brčko is a separate administrative unit-District.

In BiH there are three **National parks** and **two Nature parks**. National parks are: Sutjeska, Kozara and Una. Parks of Nature are Hutovo blato and Blidinje.


POPULATION

Resident population: are considered residents all those who are usual residents in one place, that is, those having permanent residence there, irrespective of their presence or temporary absence at the census moment.

In the Population Census in 1961 and 1971 as a resident population persons were registered where they worked at the Census moment, while in 1981 and 1991 Census these persons were enumerated as a resider population in the places where their families lived.

Population by age groups and sex 2007



POPULATION

Natural change: is the difference (surplus or deficit) between the number of births and the number of deaths in a given period.

Births and deaths: according to the legal regulations on registration, events of births and deaths are obligatorily registered in population registers of the area where they took place, irrespective of the residence of persons the events refer to.

The total fertility rate (TFR) is the number of child that would be born alive to a woman during her childbearing years, if she were to pass through all her childbering years conforming to the age-specific fert lity rates of a given year.

A Live-born child is a every child who exhibits signs of life at birth, such as breathing, beating of the heart, pulsation of the umb lical cord, or definite movements of voluntary





POPULATION

A dead person is every live-born person in which there is a permanent disappearance of all evidence of life at any time after live birth has taken place, without capability of resuscitation. Stillbirths are not included here.

Place of death and establishing of death: By this characteristic, the deceased are classified in consideration of whether the person died in health institution or some other place (house, field etc). If the place of death is some other place then the dead persons are classified whether the death was established by physician or some other person.

POPULATION

Marriages and divorces: data on marriages are taken from the registration offices, those on divorces from the municipal courts.

According to legal regulations on registration, marriages are obligator ly registered in population registers of the area where they took place, irrespective of the residence of persons the events refer to

Marriage is concidered legally regulated union life of a woman and a man concluded in accordance with the provisions of family law. Devorce of marriage is the dissolution of a marriage by judgement of a court.

Legislative power in BiH is vested in parliament. It consists of House of Representatives and House of Peoples.

All legislative decisions require approval in both Houses of the Parliamentary Assembly of BiH.

The Council of Ministers is executive authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina, exercising its rights and carrying out its duties as governmental functions, according to the Constitution of BiH, laws and other regulations of Bosnia and Herzegovina.



Civil Servant is an individual appointed to a civ I service position by an administrative act, in accordance with the Law on Civ I Service in the Institutions of BiH.







ECONOMY

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by production approach is final result of the productive activities of resident units. GDP at current prices is sum of the gross value added of all resident units at basic prices, plus taxes less subsidies on products and services.

Value added is difference between gross value production and intermediate consumption. At basic prices it excludes taxes on products and services but includes subsidies on products and services.

PRICES

Consumer price index (CPI) measures changes of prices over time, of a basket of products which represent all products meant for the final consumption by household and purchasable in the market through monetary transactions.

In 2008 the basket comprised 626 elementary products and the prices were collected in 12 localities in BiH (5 towns in Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina, 6 towns in Republika Srpska, and in Brcko District).

In 2008 the CPI BiH annual average increased by 7,43% in total due to the expenditure increase of items food and non-alcoholic beverages, followed by transport and housing, water, electricity, gas, and other fuels



PRICES

Comparative price level (PLIs): these indices refer to the total value of the individual consumtion expenditures by households, non-profit institutions serving households and general government.

PLIs provide a comparison of the countries' price level with respect to the EU average: if a price level index is higher than 100, the country concerned is relatively more expensive than the EU average and vice versa.



FOREIGN TRADE

The subject of statistics on the trading of goods is the movement of goods across frontiers of BiH. Basiclly, all physically incoming and outgoing movable goods including electricity, are recorded and documented.

The source of data for statistics on trading of goods is the Indirect Taxation Authority of BiH.



Separatelly collected types of waste comprises collected amount of paper, cardboard, glass, text le and sim lar.






